25	J	In 2015 it was my understanding that NO directional signs were to be allowed in Homewood. These are considered arrow signs pointing to a property that is for sale and/or having an open house, etc... It appears that now there are these signs popping up. My question is what is the rule on those signs? We used to buy a permit for them, then they were banned. And I put one up in a neighbor's yard with their permission only to have it removed within 1 hr by a resident, not an employee of the city. Let's have some true clarification as to the rule of these signs. I think allowing these on the weekend to advertise an open house should be acceptable and then removed after the open house.	It is now illegal to determine the permission or prohibition of signs based upon content. They would be permitted under temporary signs.
